Subject: Changing the LGBTQ Commission name to LGBTQIA+ Commission

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation to change the name of the San Mateo County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) Commission to the San Mateo County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual Plus (LGBTQIA+) Commission.

BACKGROUND:

This Board is committed to equity and inclusion for all, and over many years has strongly supported the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, asexual, and others (LGBTQIA+) community.

On June 3, 2014, seeking to continue to improve the quality of life and well-being of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ) individuals in San Mateo County, this Board established the San Mateo County LGBTQ Commission, the first such commission in the state. The purposes of the LGBTQ Commission include promoting programs that foster well-being and civic participation of LGBTQ individuals, providing support to at-risk and underserved LGBTQ populations, promoting transgender inclusion among private and public entities, developing initiatives to support LGBTQ families and children, and making recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.

DISCUSSION:

The LGBTQ Commission's name does not presently represent the queer community as a whole. For example, individuals who identify as intersex and asexual and other individuals who do not identify with any of the terms of the acronym "LGBTQ" may not see themselves represented by the current name of the Commission.

In light of this, on August 15, 2023, the Commission voted to recommend that the Board change the Commission's name. In line with its goals of fostering inclusion and improving visibility for the wider community of LGBTQIA+ individuals in San Mateo County, the LGBTQ Commission proposes adding "Intersex," "Asexual", and "Plus" to

its name. On October 17, 2023, the Commission reviewed and approved of the proposed resolution.

RESOLUTION CHANGING THE NAME OF THE SAN MATEO COUNTY LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, AND QUEER (LGBTQ) COMMISSION TO THE SAN MATEO COUNTY LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER, INTERSEX, ASEXUAL PLUS (LGBTQIA+) COMMISSION

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, on June 3, 2014, this Board adopted Resolution No. 73198, establishing the San Mateo County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) Commission, the first of its kind in the state; and

WHEREAS, this Board is committed to equity and inclusion for all, as evidenced by, for example, its efforts to advance and improve racial equity in San Mateo County, including through adoption of a Racial Equity Resolution, Resolution No. 078372, on September 14, 2021; and

WHEREAS, over many years, this Board has strongly supported the LGBTQIA+ community through numerous resolutions, events, and policies including adopting the annual Pride Resolution and Transgender Day of Remembrance Resolution since 2018, creating a visibility campaign for all cities in San Mateo County to issue a Pride Proclamation and raise the Pride Flag every June since 2020, helping to launch and financially support the San Mateo County Pride Center, and supporting the development of a transgender policy for San Mateo County employees and a pronoun resolution for the County; and

WHEREAS, the purposes of the San Mateo County LGBTQ Commission include fostering the well-being and participation of LGBTQ individuals in the community, promoting transgender inclusion among private and public entities, developing initiatives to support LGBTQ families with children, and providing outreach and support to underserved LGBTQ populations in San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, the queer community includes a diverse array of individuals and identities that are not fully represented by the categories of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ); and

WHEREAS, the San Mateo County LGBTQ Commission seeks to update its name to be more inclusive to individuals in the community whose identities are not presently reflected in the name of the Commission, including individuals who identify as intersex or asexual, and others whose identities would be represented by a "plus" sign; and

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2023, the San Mateo County LGBTQ Commission approved a motion in support of changing the name of the San Mateo County LGBTQ Commission name to the San Mateo County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual Plus (LGBTQIA+) Commission; and WHEREAS, on October 17, 2023, the Commission reviewed and approved of this resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the name of the San Mateo County LGBTQ Commission is hereby changed from the "San Mateo County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) Commission" to the "San Mateo County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual Plus (LGBTQIA+) Commission."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission and County staff shall conform the Commission's guiding documents, roster, external communications, and any other relevant records to reflect this name change.

VISIBILITY CAMPAIGN OVERVIEW

Pre-2020

County Proclamation (as early as 2015 on) and Flag-raising (as early as 2018 on).

With a 2019 Retreat, the Commission developed a Visibility Committee that focused on proclamations and flag raising across SMC. The ultimate goal was to have cities independently recognize Pride month annually on their own.

<u>2020</u>

First Visibility Campaign started, led by Lelan Anders, Giuliana Garcia and Krystle Cansino

- All cities and municipalities were invited to issue Proclamation and Raise Flag
- 20 cities issued proclamations and 14 cities raised the Pride flag.

<u>2021</u>

Second Year and still virtual campaign. Led by Giuliana Garcia, Krystle Cansino

- Pride Month Resources Webpage
- Campaign to introduce Progress Pride Flag; education and awareness-building
- All cities issued proclamations and raised flags. Some only flew the flag for a few days.

<u>2022</u>

Third Year and campaign is hybrid. No lead except for Tanya inviting all cities to participate and commissioners all followed up.

- All cities issued proclamations and majority raised Progress Pride flags.
- Raising flags in-person helped connect commissioners to city councils.

<u>2023</u>

Tanya sent email invitation. Most, if not all cities, already planned on issuing proclamations and raising Progress Pride Flags. Surprisingly, more cities than ever were planning their own independent Pride celebrations.
