Re: Highlands EIR addendum provided 5/3/21

I am writing to respectfully request a 15 day extension to the deadline for the comment period review, from Thursday 5/17 to Friday July 2nd as permitted under CEQA.

The volume of documentation for this project is now over 700 pages. The organization of the information and accessibility of key information from the County's website and records is also very poor. It almost certainly violates ADA legal requirements, but beyond that, even for fully able, online-savvy, well-educated adults used to this type of research, the County website, and the methods of organizing the documents is poor at best, and very likely incomplete.

Information to help us clearly understand, what is actually being proposed, what has been approved, how has that changed over time is not yet understood despite countless hours of diligent, good-faith study.

We urge you to extend the comment period to the full 60 days permitted under CEQA.
